

### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Park's Annual General Meeting is coming up on September 26th at 6:30 pm and will be held in the Park's 2nd Floor Dryland Training area/meeting space. All members are welcome to attend and be part of or just learn more about the governance and operation of the Springbank Park For All Seasons – Agricultural Society. The Park is governed by a Board of 18 Director positions, including user group representatives, an elected RVC Councilor, and Rocky View Schools, Trustee. There is 5 Director at Large positions and the Executive, which is also made up of 5 positions. Any member of the Society in good standing is eligible to stand for election, as a SPFAS Director at the AGM. The term of office is one year, and Directors may serve up to 5 consecutive terms if they so desire (before taking a 1-year break). The time commitment is pretty low and sees attendance at 1 monthly Board meeting (usually the 4th Monday and is typically 1 hr. to 1.75 hours in length). Meetings in the May to Aug off-season are less often and only called if business dictates.

For this coming September 26, 2022, thru to early September of 2023, we are looking to fill an Executive position, and thinking of one Director at large position, if we don't learn of other vacancies popping up prior. So, to keep the Park flourishing, and being cognizant of the need for a succession plan, we are glad to offer up the Board Member opportunity to any interested members, and or community-minded individuals interested in becoming a Board member. London, England to participate in the Platinum Jubilee celebrations. At 96 years old, Her Majesty has served as a mechanic in the war, trained and raced her own fleet of horses, personally driven around the Saudi King at a time when it was still a punishable offence for women to drive in his home country, and participated in high level tactical and political conversations with some of the most iconic leaders of our lifetime. These medals will be given to outstanding individuals who have, as she has done, dedicated their lives to family, community, and country. This is where I need your help: I am seeking nominations for the medals. If you know someone in our constituency who has led a life of service, please nominate them. We will need their:

- Age, or your closest estimate
- Field of endeavour
- Home address
- Phone number and email, and
- 300 word maximum justification for nomination.

My office will then choose those most deserving candidates and submit them to the Jubilee Medal Office



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
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Hello Springbank and area residents.

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### **DON KOCHAN, COUNCILLOR DIV 2**





Hi everyone, following is an update on division matters for your use: Customer Satisfaction Survey – the results are in on a customer satisfaction survey that was undertaken by an independent market research company – Leger. A key finding was that most resident's feel they have a good/very good quality of life in Rocky View County and that they feel safe and it is a great place to raise a family. Preserving the feeling of country life and mitigating

overpopulation will likely be important in the coming years to ensure residents quality of life remains positive. Residents are mixed on their level of overall satisfaction with the quality of services and programs suggesting an opportunity to improve various services and programs such as planning, road maintenance and municipal enforcement.

Another area for consideration is to review the level of communication provided and the method used. Providing more transparency on how feedback is used and how it impacts decisions will make residents feel that their feedback is valued and heard. There is much more information in the satisfaction survey report and it can be found on the counties website for your viewing. Springbank Area Structure Plan (ASP) – The County has received the new approved Regional Growth Plan from the Minister of Municipal Affairs. The development of the ASP would take into consideration the plan guidelines. It is anticipated that refinements to the Springbank ASP will be developed over the summer months and once finalized, the County will offer further engagement opportunities prior to a public hearing.

For project updates and all background materials, please visit: https://www.rockyview.ca/springbank-area-structure-plan Springbank Off stream Reservoir (SR1) – A presentation was provided to Council by the Province on the SR1 project. The Province provided information on a Joint Land Use Committee that has been established regarding the land use planning of the area. Membership of the committee consists of the Springbank Planning Association (SPA), Springbank Community Association (SCA), Springbank Trails and Pathways Association (STAPA), local ranchers, Indigenous group representation, and Rocky View administration. Work of the committee is expected to continue over the summer.

Rocky View County Open House July 20th - It has been two years since our last Open House, and we welcomed back residents to this fun-filled annual event. There was a free pancake breakfast, displays from County departments: fire, enforcement, transportation, waste and recycling, and agriculture - fire trucks, graders and equipment displays and there was also live music and family-friendly activities, such as face painting, a clown, and a petting zoo. This event was an excellent opportunity to mingle with other residents and learn more about County services and departments. Rocky View Counties Agricultural Tour July 21 - This year's tour featured Calgary Farmyard, Prairie Berry YYC, Wilderness Alpacas, Alberta Carriage Supply, and Decisive Farming by Telus Agriculture. All five entrepreneurs are located in the eastern

part of Rocky View. At the completion of the tour a dinner at the Balzac community hall was enjoyed with a presentation from a 4-H special guest speaker (Sage Wilkins) and the 2022 Master Farm Family Award was presented to Cleveland Ventures Ltd. (Keith, Rhonda and sons).

Duke of Edinburgh Award – Along with Judi Hunter (Rocky View School Trustee), I presented the Springbank area Duke of Edinburgh silver awards to Zach Murray, Cole Inverarity, Simon Beler, and Kaelen Hunter. The international award is achieved by undertaking numerous hours of service in the categories of physical fitness, skills development, community service and adventure journey. All four award achievers have been accepted into post secondary institutions to pursue their dreams in engineering, finance, and business.

New Virtual Services Available to Rocky View Residents – Rocky View County now offers property, tax, and utility services online through a new customer service portal — my.RockyView.ca. The new portal makes County services, previously only available in-person or by telephone, more accessible and convenient for residents. The new portal requires residents to create an account to access the following county services online: • Property assessment information • Property tax payments and balances • Tax certificates • Utility payments, balances, and billing history • Mortgage holdings Residents can visit my.rockyview.ca to sign up and get started.

Webber Academy Athletic Park – A new sports facility is presently being constructed in the Springbank area. The athletic park will feature 4 baseball fields, a soccer field, and a 50,000 square foot two storey multipurpose indoor field house. Ball diamond number 1 having an artificial turf has been completed and the venue has had a baseball clinic with some Blue Jay players providing the coaching skills. The field house is expected to be completed in September.

We have had a great summer, so far, and in driving around the County, I see many beautiful yards and properties. It is so nice to not have a lot of restrictions on travel and gatherings, now, and I am seeing more activity in the campgrounds, when my hubby and I go camping. As we become more mobile and get out and about, so do others with not so good intent. Here is a tool to consider for your Crime Prevention routine both for when home and away.

CPTED: As we near the latter days of summer and look to readying yards and properties for fall, have you thought to consider how you could make your yard be a part of your crime prevention routine? There are things that you can do to deter criminals using landscaping and other tools. CPTED is Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design and it has a host of ideas and suggestions on how to use landscaping and lighting as tools.

### A few Tips are:

- Keep bushes and hedges under three feet in height.
- Trim tall trees to have 7 Ft. clearance under to aid sight lines.
- · Grow thorny plants
- · Create barriers with fences, pavement and plants
- Add lighting see and be seen; applies to you seeing out and seeing Individuals in your yard.
- Use signage as a deterrent No Trespassing Crime Watch Member
- Monitored Premises, etc.

The west 10 acres of the park (the open field with large-scale sculptures at the front of the park) are open for you to wander at your leisure without a guide from Thursday to Sunday, 10am 7pm. (Please be sure to have dogs on leashes and to pick up after them thank you!)



- Thanks to the generous support of Rocky View County, a Neighbours Path was installed last year on the west edge of KOAC, parallel to Horizon View Road, to provide a safe place for neighbours to walk and enjoy the view of both the sculptures and the surrounding beauty of Springbank.
