On October 11th, Danielle Smith was sworn in as the 19th Premier of Alberta after being voted in as the new leader of our United Conservative Party. Over 120,000 Albertans purchased a United Conservative membership to vote in this process, and after six rounds of voting on a pref-

erential ballot, with 53.7% of the vote, Danielle emerged the winner. With plans to fortify Alberta by exerting authority over jurisdiction that should have always been our own, and by making changes to the Alberta Human Rights Act, her Premiership will mark a bold and exciting new direction for our province. For the past three years our Government has taken initiative to stand up for the Alberta's people and industries by fighting both the carbon tax and the no-more-pipelines legislation all the way to the Supreme Court, achieving methane equivalency agreements with the federal government to avoid sterilization of our oil patch, appointing our first ever Chief Firearms Officer, and hosting an equalization referendum. Still, voters made it abundantly clear that there is far more work vet to be done. In fact, if one single thing became the most clear throughout the leadership race, it was that voting members of the UCP were exhausted by the in-fighting amongst conservatives, and want to see us turn our efforts against Ottawa rather than against ourselves - which I could not agree with more. It is no secret that I supported Travis Toews in his bid for leadership. After working alongside him for three years, and very closely more recently, I grew to know him as fiercely principled in his conservatism, firm in his faith, and compassionate in his leadership - all values I was keenly looking for in a leader. I consider it an honour to have spent my summer travelling with him and helping his campaign, but now is the time to move forward. I want to be clear that I remain committed to our United Conservative movement, the people of Banff-Kananaskis, and the province of Alberta. While I strongly supported Travis in his leadership campaign, I have, for the past couple years now, considered Danielle to be a friend, and someone who I admire much about as a leader. She is intelligent, articulate, collaborative, and hard working, and I am confident she will make

an excellent Premier. I would be remiss if I did not say thank you to our outgoing Premier, Jason Kenney. While many across the province will bid him farewell with mixed emotions, some positive and some negative, there is no denying that he worked tirelessly in his role as Premier. In the midst of a pandemic and a collapse in oil prices, he lead our province from economic and fiscal despair into an astounding state of economic recovery. Today, Alberta's economy is more diversified than ever before, and we owe much of that success to his probusiness policies and investment advocacy. As Danielle Smith will not have a seat in the Legislative Assembly until after her by-election, the House will not resume until late November. Until such a time, I am unable to provide more of an update regarding what the make-up of Cabinet will look like, what the contents of the Sovereignty Act will be, or what else will be in our next legislative agenda. Much remains to be determined, but our conservative movement is bigger and stronger today than it has ever been, and I am confident that Alberta has many bright days ahead.

Hopefully everyone had a great summer. It certainly was one of our better ones weather wise.

Following is some information that involves Division 2:

Springbank Area Structure Plan (ASP) – Administration

provided an update to Council on the status of the proposed new Springbank ASP. You can expect a summary report of the communities' feedback that was provided thus far through the various feedback sessions. You may view this report on RVC's website. The next steps would be to further engage the community to ensure we have interpreted the communities' feedback properly. After the feedback sessions are complete a draft ASP will be developed and put forward for a public hearing before proceeding for the bylaw readings.

Springbank Off stream Reservoir (SR1) – The Joint Land Use Committee that has been established regarding the land use planning of the area has been working towards proposing various recreational needs that could be incorporated into the SR1 project. Membership of the committee consists of the Springbank Planning Association (SPA), Springbank Community Association (SCA), Springbank Trails and Pathways Association (STAPA), local ranchers, Indigenous group representation, and Rocky View administration. One of the initiatives for the committee is to explore and advocate for the construction of a north south pathway connection along RR 40 in order to provide for a safe active transportation corridor. Administration is planning on providing a progress report on the committees work to Council by the end of February.

New Virtual Services Available – Just a reminder to take advantage of Rocky View's online customer service portal — my.RockyView.ca. The new portal makes County services, previously only available in-person or by telephone, more accessible and convenient for residents. The new portal requires residents to create an account to access the following county services online: • Property assessment information • Property tax payments and balances • Tax certificates • Utility payments, balances, and billing history • Mortgage holdings Residents can visit my.rockyview.ca to sign up and get started.

School Speed Limit Signage - You may have noticed a change

in signage for speed limits on RR33 and Springbank Road. This was initiated through an independent engineering report that was submitted to the County relating to the school zones along Range Road 33 and Springbank Road. The analysis identified areas of concern for the school zones in regards to current Alberta Transportation standards.

The County reviewed the report and confirmed the following additions/measures were necessary to align with Alberta Transportation standards.

The following was implemented:

-day and time signs indicating when the school zone is in effect were changed to a full sized sign rather than tab size sign for improved visuals for motorists.

-30 km speed sign was changed from a tab sized sign to a full size sign for improved visuals.

-a speed reduction zone was added in all directions prior to entering the school zone allowing motorists the time and space for a gradual speed reduction from, 80km to 60km/h to 30km/h, rather than 80km/h down to 30km/h.

There has been no change to the school zones only changes to improve awareness of the zones themselves.

Hello again Park Patter readers, I am back at it, as the Rocky View County Liaison for RCMP.

What is a mummy's favorite type of music? Wrap! What do little trees say on Halloween? Twig or Treat.

The grandparent scam is on the rise again, and continues to be a consistent scam circulating around. In 2021, the Canadian Anti-Fraud Center received 379 cases involving 115 victims. These losses totaled more than \$1.7 million!

Since January of 2022, the center says there has been 674 cases, involving 273 victims, but have already had \$2.7 million in losses. This is staggering and very concerning.

The scam goes like this, the scammer calls a phone number and sounds very distressed, and usually starts to cry. The scammer then either changes their voice, or may hand the phone over to another person, who then impersonates a police officer, lawyer or bail officer. They will demand payment by cash, but sometimes by wire transfer or direct deposit. If the victim agrees to pay, someone may come to the victim's home to collect the money.

How should you protect yourself or others? If you receive a suspicious sounding phone call from someone claiming to be a family member, you should hang up and contact that family member directly, with the number that you have for them.

As well if the scammer is claiming to be a law enforcement agent, hang up and call your local police department. Listening to your gut instinct, if it doesn't feel right, then it is probably not right, hang up.

Sometimes the scammers use a technology called caller ID spoofing, in order to make the call seem more legitimate number, like a police number from your local police department. Communication with your family members is key as well, have those tough conversations can save a lot of heart ache in the future.

If you believe that you have been scammed, call the RCMP, and call the Canadian Anti-Fraud Center, 1-888-495-8501.





As the seasons shift, the burst of excitement and energy of September shifts quickly into juggling many priorities and fuller family schedules. Setting aside time to plan, involve your children in decision making (yes, they need a lunch EVERYDAY!) and taking care of yourself are all strategies to help you feel prepared this month. At Village Sports we prioritize supporting, not only our student-athletes, but the parents, caregivers and families that surround them. We asked Village parents for their top tips to keep their families and themselves as balanced as possible during this transition back to school and activities.

This is what we heard:

- Fill the car with gas on Sundays to set yourself up for the week




