Introducing Alberta's new Parliamentary Secretary for Tourism: me! Last month I was humbled and honoured to be sworn in as Alberta's Parliamentary Secretary for Tourism as part of Premier Danielle Smith's new leadership team. Parliamentary Secretaries work as key representatives of their respective portfolios. In this role, in addition to my duties as your MLA, I will work closely

with Minister Todd Loewen of Forestry, Parks and Tourism to champion our government's policy development and stakeholder engagement with regards to tourism. Over the past three years I have had the absolute pleasure of working with and getting to know our province's many tourism and hospitality operators, entrepreneurs, and industry partners – both here in Banff-Kananaskis and far beyond. With expenditures peaking above \$10 billion in 2019 from 34 million visitors, and a contribution of \$8.4 billion in GDP and 82,000 full time jobs to Alberta's economy, our tourism industry is world class. Still, there is boundless opportunity across our beautiful province to strengthen, grow, and diversify.

In my first meeting with Premier Smith after her United Conservative leadership victory, knowing that most MLAs in my caucus would give voice to Alberta's resource industries but that few were as well-equipped to give voice to the unique world of tourism as myself, discussing the growth and vitality of our tourism sector was my primary focus. Supported by no less than 250 pages of highlighted, tabbed, and organized research which I compiled and brought to our meeting, she and I discussed the immense potential for this industry, and what it needed to thrive. It was that conversation that inevitably led to my appointment. With this appointment, but only six months until the Spring election, Minister Loewen and I have a lot of work to do in a short amount of time. Recognizing this, we immediately got together after being sworn in and concluded that the industry's biggest opportunity was in recreational tourism; the industry's biggest constraint was access to labour, and that the industry's biggest limitation to reaching new markets was sustainable funding for Travel Alberta.

Based on these conclusions, Minister Loewen and I promptly submitted a package to Premier Smith detailing how we believed best to address that which we had identified. Shortly thereafter we received our mandate letter from the Premier which accepted all of the ideas we had submitted in addition to providing us with an even more expansive mandate. We are going to have our hands full! Given that 60% of our beautiful province's landmass is Crown Land, there is tremendous opportunity grow our recreational economy. Unfortunately our Crown Land policy in its current form is restrictive, and has resulted in a \$10 billion tourism trade deficit to British Columbia. To increase Alberta's recreational competitiveness, Minister Loewen and I will begin the important work of developing clear, concise, policy that will empower Alberta entrepreneurs to create opportunities for Albertans and visitors alike to experience Alberta's wild.

Tourism and hospitality's heavy reliance on international and temporary foreign workers, amongst other factors, has resulted in a systemic labour shortage. Even in times of economic stagnation in Alberta, when other sectors struggled with high unemployment, these sectors maintained more jobs available than they were able to fill. Today the industry has more than a 20% labour shortage in some areas of the province, forcing hotels and businesses to shutter their doors for time when they would otherwise be open. While immigration is largely under federal jurisdiction, Minister Loewen and I will immediately begin the work of pursuing an expedited tourism and hospitality immigration stream through channels which the province can control in hopes of easing the strains caused by the labour shortages for the winter ski season.

Finally, to ensure that Travel Alberta can fulfill its complete mandate of not only promoting Alberta to key international markets but of undertaking tourism policy development, partnering with private industry to expand experiential offerings in the province, and establishing new international markets from which to attract visitors, Minister Loewen and I will assess the advantages of having the full 4% overnight hotel levy invested fully in Travel Alberta. When this levy was initially introduced in Alberta years ago, its intent was solely to support Travel Alberta and guarantee the agency sustainable funding that would not be beholden to the whims of subsequent governments and their budgeting priorities. Unfortunately with time, governments began diverting the levy into the government's general revenue fund. Travel Alberta has tremendous potential to usher in growth, but they need reliable funding to do so. In addition to these key priorities which Minister Loewen and I set together, we have also been given instruction by Premier Smith to shorten permit and license approvals for new tourism ventures; invest in the infrastructure of Kananaskis, Waiporous, and other high traffic areas; initiate negotiations with the federal government to ensure national park pass revenues generated from Alberta national parks stay within Alberta national parks, and develop a long-term growth strategy for the industry.

There are very few places on earth to whom a thriving tourism economy comes more naturally than our beautiful province of Alberta, and it is time that we recognize that beauty as the true natural resource that it is.

I am grateful to Premier Smith for understanding the important existence of tourism as part of Alberta's economic future. For a government to produce such an extensive list of mandates related to specifically to tourism, an industry that for far too long has gone overlooked, is unheard of in recent Albertan history. This signifies the dedication that myself and our United Conservative government have to the industry's many entrepreneurs and visionaries, and to Alberta's broader economic diversification. Together we will strengthen the sector, provide it with opportunities to flourish, and secure jurisdiction over that which is rightfully Alberta's. Now, it's time to get to work!



#### December 2022 Update

Council Changes – An organizational meeting was held on October 25th that resulted in a few position changes. Although my appointment as Mayor was for 2 years, I have decided to step down as Mayor and resume my Councilor role and focus on Division 2 items such as the Springbank ASP that is being developed, the Springbank

Community Centre and recreational facilities that are being planned as well as the transportation and water coop issues that have been coming to the forefront. All further Mayor appointments will be for one year as per the new procedural bylaw. Rocky View's new Mayor and Deputy Mayor are Crystal Kissel and Sunny Samra respectively.

Council has also established a Governance Committee made up of all Council members and I have been appointed to chair that committee. The establishment of a Governance Committee is to help Councilors better manage public meeting times, and to provide a venue for more in-depth discussions with County staff on questions of governance outside of regular bi-weekly council gatherings. Council will have an opportunity to provide administration direction before an item comes to Council for a decision.

Rural Municipalities Association Conference – Council attended the annual conference for rural municipalities in the first week of November. The conference included a series of workshops and a ministerial forum whereby the delegates were able to ask questions of the ministers regarding issues in their municipality. Health care, agriculture and reclamation practices were some of the prime topics that were questioned.

There were also presentations provided by the Nurse Practitioner Association, Alberta Energy Association, Alberta Roadbuilders & Heavy Construction Association, RCMP, etc. The premier also provided a keynote address for the delegates.

2023 Budget - Council has commenced budget discussions in November. Further budget meetings are required and it hoped to have an approved budget by the end of the year. Presently RVC is projecting around a 6% increase in taxes to maintain our services levels. Springbank Area Structure Plan (ASP) -Administration is continuing its work on drafting the new ASP with the feedback outlined in the Engagement Summary being considered against other influences such as the Regional Growth Plan and technical constraints. As required by the Regional Growth Plan, administration has started an Environmental Screening Report to update the previous Wildlife Corridor study. Administration hopes that they will have an initial draft ASP available in January. Administration will present the updated plan to the Springbank community in the New Year. An Engagement Summary Report of the communities' input can be found on the county web-site. Please visit: https://www. rockyview.ca/springbank-area-structure-plan

Special Event Permitting – As a result of the issues that have come up regarding permitting of special events, it is proposed to change Special Function Business & Home-Based Business Type III regulations. The proposal is being presented to Council on January 23, 2022. Subject to Council approval, future Special Function Business applications in residential and agricultural areas would be required to complete a land use amendment to include a Home-Based Business, Type III (HBB, Type III) use. Special Function Business will no longer be an allowed use and future wedding-type venue applications will be considered as HBB, Type III.

The Special Event Application process through Recreation, Parks & Community Support (for one-time event applications) is scheduled to go before Council on December 13th. There are proposed changes to the bylaw that outline a more streamlined definition, stronger residential notification requirements to name a few improvements to the bylaw.

Best wishes for our winter break and for the new year.

Good news ... The Board has received \$908 000.00 to expand the Stepping Stones mental health program that is currently operating in our schools. This funding will provide more service in all our schools with grades 5 to

9. Thank you to Lori Meyer, Sherri Black, and Jodi Neetz for their successful application!

The funding is in addition to:

- \$1.4 billion in Learning Support funding to meet the specialized learning needs of students and provide them with additional supports, such as student wellness programs.
- · Alberta's recent announcement of \$87 million over three years to help support the development of a schoolbased services model to integrate and expand access to addiction and mental health services for children and youth from elementary to high school.

The expansion of the Integrated Schools Support Program to provide children and youth with prevention and early intervention supports that improve their health, wellness, and quality of life by building strength and resilience.

It is encouraging to see, government ministries working together. The ministry of Health link contains many connections to education Child and Youth Well-being Action Plan I would encourage community groups and schools to read this plan as there maybe opportunities for funding local initiatives.

Rocky View Schools applied for and received \$384 306 learning disruption funding to provide between 12 and 16 weeks of targeted programming during this school year. School authorities will have the flexibility to design this programming to best meet their local needs.

At the recent Alberta School Boards Association, Minister of Education LaGrange announced that the first option for new school builds will no longer be Public, Private Partnership(P3s). This news was welcomed by Boards across the province.

Springbank High School Drama presents "The Three Musketeers" November 30 to December 2.


Canadian Parents for French appreciates all parents who supported the "Cheese Fundraiser". Funds will be used to support French culture week and French language activities for immersion students.

Merry Christmas Everyone! What do you call an elf wearing ear muffs? Anything you want. He can't hear you!! What do you get when you cross a snowman and a vampire? Frostbite!!

In December 2020, Alberta brought about new Impaired Driving Laws, under the Provincial Administrative Penalties Act. The change made by the Province of Alberta was to modify how impaired drivers are being penalized, by taking them out of the courts, to free up court time and police resources.

The act introduced new immediate roadside penalties, while still getting impaired drivers off the street. For

more serious cases, these will receive the same roadside penalties, and still be prosecuted in court. These cases can include repeat offenders, impaired driving causing harm or death. BC has had a similar system in place for a bit, and has proven to deter impaired driving there. Alberta will have some of the toughest impaired driving laws in the country, with these new changes.

Some of the key changes were, new fines up to \$2000, increased length of vehicle seizures up to 30 days for certain offences, increased drivers licence suspensions for repeat offenders, and expanded mandatory ignition interlock for repeat offenders. Commercial drivers and novice drivers will have new zero tolerance consequences as well. All of these changes are to make Alberta roads safer.

Cochrane RCMP is always on the lookout for impaired drivers, but also ask for the publics help in reporting impaired driving. Calling 911 when you see some driving that is out of the ordinary, or you suspect that someone may be driving impaired. You can be impaired by both alcohol and drug, and both carry the same penalties, either provincially or federally.
