In the last Park Patter Newsletter, I remember mentioning the snow had been melting fast, and now September's special Fall edition is released. Here below is some of the mentioned Park's history (that you will see highlighted along our main floor hallway, and we have historic pictures and history information upstairs on the wall by the Board Room as well - overlooking the Red Dutton arena). You should find them to be some interesting reading, and besides the great accomplishments and donations of Mervyn (Red) Dutton, who even though getting injured in the war, still found a way to train his way back to make it into the NHL (as a player, coach, GM & President). Red also went on to run a very successful Standard General Construction business (that built McMahon Stadium). I thought the other story of Matti Robinson (whose family donated the land the Park currently sits on), to be a great community service one; as Matti annually used to bake a 12lb fruit cake, (that's big), and in 1982 the last one she raffled off for \$2200, which she then donated the proceeds back to the Park.

## **SPFAS HISTORY RECAP**

1968 – Jim & Irene Robinson donated the land to & for the SPFAS

1968 – Mervyn "Red" Dutton matched the funds raised at a dinner to build the 1st of 3 Arenas (with real Ice, that tended to melt). Red made it to the NHL as a player, coach, President & GM, and was also, the owner of Standard General Construction the group that built Mc Mahon Stadium

1971-72 – SPFAS was incorporated as an Agricultural Society

1972 – Artificial Ice and Ice Plant was added to the Red Dutton Arena (with more funding Asst by Red D.)

1975 – The Springbank Community High School was added to the property (& a 50 yr. Reciprocal land use Agreement through Rocky View County was put in place)

1979 - the Curling Rink was added

1997 - the Joe Phillips Arena was added (Joe was a Springbank Resident and Oil & Gas Executive)

2007 - the Outdoor Covered Rink was added

2021-22 - SPFAS carried out a \$2.8m Facility Renovations

and Enhancement project

2023-24 – there are lots on other planning initiatives on the go, and the well being of the Park and it's members and the community it serves are always being kept in mind - paralleling the Park's Mission Statement ("To facilitate and promote recreational, social, cultural, and agricultural initiatives that build communities").







The Park's Annual General Meeting is coming up on September 25th at 6:30 pm and will be held in the Park's 2nd Floor Dryland Training area/meeting space. All members are welcome to attend and be part of or just learn more about the governance and operation of the Springbank Park For All Seasons – Agricultural Society.

The Park is governed by a Board of 18 Director positions, including user group representatives, an elected RVC Councilor, and Rocky View Schools, Trustee. There is 5 Director at Large positions and the Executive, which is also made up of 5 positions. Any member of the Society in good standing is eligible to stand for election, as a SPFAS Director at the AGM.

The term of office is one year, and Directors may serve up to 5 consecutive terms if they so desire (before taking a 1-year break). The time commitment is pretty low and sees attendance at 1 monthly Board meeting (usually the 4th Monday and is typically 1 hr. to 1.75 hours in length). Meetings are typically held in Sept thru to June, with July and Aug off.

For this coming September 25, 2023, thru to early September of 2024, we are looking to possibly fill one Executive Board Secretary (that isn't required to take minutes) position and thinking of one Director at large position.

"Not enough," the student replies, "They said I have to go back tomorrow!"

Why did the M&M go to school? Because he really wanted to be a Smartie!

Welcome back everyone from a summer full of fun and excitement. I hope that everyone was able to enjoy some family time, and got outside to enjoy the weather, in between the smoky days.

It is that time of year again, it is hard to believe that we are back in school and back into routine. Parents, care givers are probably excited about the kids getting back to school so that they can have some piece and quiet for a bit!

This time of year, we have to be careful of the students who are getting back to school and may not be paying

attention to vehicles. Students are going to be excited about seeing their old friends and making new friends. As drivers we need to make sure we are being diligent in following the speed in the school zones, using caution around parking lots and following the signals on the buses.

A few gentle reminders for drivers, school zones and playground zones serve an important role in keeping pedestrians safe. The speed limit in school zones is 30km/hr across Alberta. The speed limit saves lives, slower speed equals more time to react, and short stopping distances.

Drivers should also watch around school buses, they are big and have large blind spots and poor manoeuvrability, and most important they are carrying children!

Scanning between parked cars, never making a U-turn near crosswalks, and never stop in a crosswalk.

Driving distraction free is a major factor in keeping the students safe, keeping your eyes on the road, and both hands on the wheel, for ultimate safety.

When a school bus activates it's alternating red flashing lights, this means you must come to a stop whether you are approaching an oncoming school bus or following one. The fine for passing a school bus with it's red lights flashing is \$567 plus six demerit points.

Let's all work towards making this the best start to the school year ever.

- Thefts over \$5,000 are accepted from oil, telecommunications, and utility companies.

## SPRINGBANK FRIDAY MORNING 50+ MIXED CURLING LEAGUE


