General Rules & Etiquette

Please read ALL sections carefully!

- 1. Entry Fee: 25 cents per entry. All ages allowed two entries per class number, except where specified. Individual entries must be made in person. An entry cannot be placed in two classes; one class must be chosen.
- 2. **Exhibit Registration Times:**
 - Thursday, September 4th, 6:00pm-9:00pm All Arts, Photography, Crafts and Hobbies entries must be brought in at this time (Horticulture and Cooking also accepted).
 - Friday, September 5th, 2:30pm-6:00pm

 Only Horticulture and Cooking entries will be accepted. No Arts, Photography, Crafts and Hobbies will be accepted this day. Doors will be closed at 6:00pm sharp.
 - Judging will begin at 7:00pm. The Show will be open for viewing at 10:00am on Saturday, September 6th.
- 3. **Location:** All entries must be delivered to the Springbank Park For All Seasons Curling Rink.
- 4. **Registration Number:** All entrants will receive a registration number to be used on all entry tags along with the entrants name. Please pick up your tags and registration number ahead of time from the SPFAS Administration Office.
- 5. **Entry Tags:** Available to be picked up from the SPFAS Administration Office starting August 5th, Monday to Friday from 9am to 3pm. We request that exhibitors entering more than 5 entries obtain their entry tags prior to September 4th and have them completed prior to delivering entries. Children's entry tags must be labeled with the correct age category. All entry tags will be paid for at pick up, any unused tags will be reimbursed if returned.
- 6. **Ownership:** All entries must be the work of the exhibitor, and must not have been shown in previous Springbank Park For All Seasons Agricultural Society Fall Fairs.
- 7. **Judging:** Containers do not count in judging unless one is specified. **Note carefully the number of articles required for each class number and any other particulars given for each class, errors may disqualify the entry**. In all cases, the judge's decision is final. Classes may be set up at the discretion of the judges or a class may be subdivided if there are numerous entries. <u>The Danish system of judging is used in this competition</u>. In this system, coloured ribbons are used to indicate the placing in the competition. Each entry is judged against a standard and is given a rating. Each entry will receive points and a placement ribbon. <u>One first, second and third placing will be awarded per class</u>. All judge's decisions are final.

Ribbons are awarded in each class number. **Red ribbon (1st place)=3 points, Blue ribbon (2nd place)=2 points, White ribbon (3rd place)=1 point.** Cash prizes will be awarded to the winner of each category and sub-category (not individual class numbers). Trophies are awarded on the basis of a total point system for each category.

It is the prize winner's responsibility to pick up their awarded prize the day of the Fall Fair (unless other arrangements have previously been made). Any unclaimed prizes will be used in the following Fall Fair.

- 8. **Disclaimer:** Neither the Fall Fair Organizing Committee nor the Springbank Park For All Seasons Agricultural Society is responsible for any loss or damages to property while it is on exhibit. The committee shall take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of all articles.
- 9. **Removal of Entries:** Entries may not be removed from the display <u>until after the awards presentation on Saturday afternoon</u>. Any articles remaining unclaimed after 4:30pm on the day of the show will become the property of the show committee.
- 10. SPFAS would be pleased to recycle ribbons, please bring any previous year's ribbons to registration.

Lazy Daisy Cake Recipe taken from the 1954 Springbank UCW Cookbook

Submitted By Terry Ona

2 eggs 1 cup flour
1 cup sugar 1 tsp. baking powder
1/2 cup milk 1 tsp. vanilla
1 tbsp. butter Pinch of salt

Heat milk and butter, beat eggs, add sugar, beating well. Stir in dry ingredients. Add vanilla and carefully stir in hot milk and butter. Batter is very thin.

Bake in shallow pan (9" square pan) for 25 mins at 350 degrees F. After baking, cover the top with the following:

Combine 2/3 cup brown sugar, 1/3 cup melted butter, 1 cup coconut, 4 tbsp. cream. Spread on top of baked cake and put under broiler until brown and bubbly. (Leave cake in pan to exhibit)

1 cup white sugar

1 tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. baking powder

½ tsp. salt

4 tbsp. cocoa

Make 3 holes in dry ingredients.

1st hole put 1 tbsp. vinegar

2nd hole put 1 tsp. vanilla

3rd hole put 5 tbsp. melted butter
